As part of the World Environment Day 2025 celebrations, the Department of Environmental Science in collaboration with Eco club and NSS units, Government Degree College Tral, organized a Nukkad Natak (Street Play) on 5th June 2025, focusing on the urgent issue of Plastic Pollution.
